TAKE TIME TO STOP

Our lives are filled with frenetic activity. We race from home to work, to school, to doctor appointments, practices, restaurants, and sporting events. Even the church adds to our calendar, as we shuffle back and forth from Sunday Services, Leadership meetings, Fellowship lunch, Supper Club, Bible studies, and Work Days.

But there are a couple of times a year when the body of Christ comes together to sit; to stare; to stop and to gaze. Christmas and Easter are those quiet, holy, time---stilling moments of the church.

Have you ever been in a moment where it seemed like time stood still? Maybe it was your wedding day as you made your vows before God and others. Maybe it was a crisis – a car accident that seemed to happen in slow motion. Maybe it was the day your baby was born, or the day your loved one died. Whatever the event, time stopped. And you sat, stared, and pondered.

Holy Week is a time for stopping. When you read the Gospel of John, you find Jesus talking a lot about "his hour" and the "time that is coming." John tells us over and over again, "his hour had not yet come." We have studied this several times in our Bible study.

But beginning in chapter 12, the narrative slows down and crawls through the next thirty-six hours of Jesus' earthly life. Jesus talks to His disciples in the upper room. He brings comfort to them. He challenges them. He provokes them. And then the hours pass by as Jesus goes from the Garden to the palace, and then to the hill, where His heart will stop beating.

The best way to celebrate this week is to sense the stopping of time, and to remember the moments at the heart of our faith; to simply marvel at the Word of God and what these precious events mean; to listen for the Old Testament echoes, to catch the Old Testament overtones and familiar melodies that resound through the Gospel writers' symphony of the cross; to look at Jesus – the One crucified in our place, who loved us and died for us.

Behold! That's an old biblical word that says, "Stop and look." So try to take time this week and begin to stop, gaze, and ponder at the crucified One.

He is Risen, He is risen indeed!

HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH MEETING February 11, 2018

We approved budget for 2018. Joann Warner stated we are in the best position financially since she has overseen the finances of the church.

We thank those who have given generously for their donations and for the one time gift from Big Valley Church.

We approved work to be done from the water leak, which will be rerouting copper piping for back bathroom and Memorial garden water access.

Dave Baker also let us know that the renters have vacated from Broadway house so there is a ton of work to be done. This includes carpeting, stove(with fan) and dishwasher replacement, along with window repairs and redoing bathroom surfaces. Needs interior painting as well as outside repair with painting also. Approval of up to \$10,000 for needed work to be done to bring house up to code and suitable for future renters.

Our Pastor James reported the main push this year will be for the children, which is our future for the church. We have people pouring over the curriculum and their needs will be met. Also, we need to be praying on our approach to the back parking lot, which we will definitely be needing. Prayers are being answered with growth in numbers but spiritually as well, shown with new Bible groups forming.

Applauds were given for all of Pastor James efforts.

Linda Kendall was approved by church members for appointment to be a Deaconate.

Pastor James called all the board and committee members to come forward as he Installed them for 2018. Pastor James and congregation then prayed over all the servants of the church.

Phyllis Agers suggested that some of the fundraising funds be used for Lu and James to attend the Annual Meeting for the NACC in June.


If we could just remember to turn every situation over to God, He would give us the strength and we would fly like eagles.

NORCAL MEETING

Our Northern California group of NACCC Churches gathered at Grace North Church in Berkeley on January 13, 2018. Pastor James & Lu, Lee Unruh, Elaine Tindle & Phyllis Agers attended from Salida Congregational Church. Several other churches were represented, including Soquel, Paradise, and Broadmoore in Walnut Creek.

Donuts and coffee were ready for us when we arrived at 9:30, with a chance to chat with others, before the worship service began at 10:30 with excellent music with guitar accompaniment, wonderful voices, and an inspiring talk.

Scriptures were from Psalms and Proverbs: Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans. Pr.16:3 May he give you the desire of your heart and make all your plans succeed. Ps.20:4 In their hearts humans plan their course, but the Lord establishes their steps. Pr.16:9 Let the morning bring me word of your unfailing love, for I have put my trust in you. Show me the way I should go, for to you I entrust my life. Ps.143:8 And then we sang, 'Here I am Lord.'

Before lunch we had a chance to meet in small groups with others not from our own church to discuss 3 topics: 1. What are the highlights from your church's past year? 2. What challenges are you facing right now? 3. What is God calling you to right now?

After a salad lunch we had guests from Cal West, Southern Calf. who are busy planning the Annual Meeting and Conference to take place in San Diego, June 23rd, to 26th, later this year. It will be at the Marriott in Mission Valley, a bit cheaper than San Diego proper, but still rooms will be \$168. per night. If you take the train down you can get a trolley from the train station which goes right to the hotel. She recommends Southwest as having reasonable flights. Lunch is provided in the price of registration which runs about \$100 per day.

The Congregational Speaker, Rev. Dr. Lowell Linden, will be speaking on Congregationalism in the first 25 years in Calif. 1848-1873. Soquel's pastor reminded him that his church should be included as they will be celebrating 150 years this year, as they were founded in 1868... and we thought we were old...


After the conference they're offering a day tour to Pan American Institute, in Mexico, so you will need your passport. I believe they said only about \$50 or \$60. More info to come.

A short business meeting followed. Pastor Marcia, from Broadmoore, volunteered to be moderator with Robert Hellam. Our own Pastor James volunteered to be on the board. He was going to invite them to have the next meeting here in Salida, but Paradise's new pastor beat him to it.

Personally, I would like to suggest that we have some fund raisers, so that Pastor James and Lu could go to the meeting in San Diego in June.

PRAYER CARDS

We already have two people that have been affected by this effective tool. In closing scripture says, "The effectual fervent prayer of the righteous has great power in its working' (James 5:16b). Let us make an impact upon this Salida community for Christ!



GRANDMA'S HOUSE

Dale's mom passed away Thanksgiving morning 11/23/2017. It was a 'good time' for her, because so many of the relatives were in town for Turkey Day, and they were able to see her.

Grandma moved down from Soulsbyville in 2007 when she and Myron had decided they needed to be closer to family. Scot, Dale's eldest son had rehab one of those big Graceada Park houses, and he said they could live there as long as they wanted, at no cost. They so loved the house-Big house and bigger yard, served us well for many parties.

But now the time had come to dispose of the house. Scot was going to sell it. Scot and family had moved to Montana about 6 or 7 years ago, they had jobs there and neither of them would be able take extended time off to spruce the house up to sell. So the week after grandma passed the sons and daughter and daughter in laws started clearing 'stuff' out. Suzie (many of you know her as Lynn) had come up to be with grandma after Myron passed 5 years ago. So she was going to return to Long Beach. Rev Frost mentioned 'we all have too much stuff'-a

truer word was never spoken. Just for example: There were 3 desks and I went through one and noticed that there was stuff from the late 1990s and early 2000s, and I asked if they had sorted stuff when they moved in 2007. No was that answer. All papers were sorted to garbage or shred. There was so much stuff. The ladies worked several weeks getting that all done. All cupboards were emptied, cleaned and everything packed up. Clothes had to be sorted, cleaned and given away. The furniture, many pictures, dishes, "stuff" had to be disposed of. So many trips to Hospice and other same type of agencies.



Grandma was a writer. She would get a spiraled notebook and she may only write on 3 pages in the whole thing or she may have filled it up with her musing. 


