I know I usually have a post regarding the Lenten and Easter season in this time of the year, but a commercial recently came up during the Super Bowl, and so I would like to address a little bit about the Jesus "gets us" campaign. And this also goes well with what we have been discussing recently in our Hebrews study regarding false teachers and their message.

Now as I was looking into this situation, I found an article from a pastor, with whom I respect very much, by the name of Mike Riccardi, and instead of befuddling the situation, I will just show you what he has written.

Mike said this, Jesus does indeed "get us." And this is what He has to say about us:

"For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed the evil thoughts, fornications, thefts, murders, adulteries, deeds of coveting and wickedness, as well as deceit, sensuality, envy, slander, pride and foolishness. All these evil things proceed from within and defile the man" (Mark 7:21-23).

"...but unless you repent, you will all likewise perish" (Luke 13:5).

"I say to you, My friends, do not be afraid of those who kill the body and after that have no more that they can do. But I will warn you whom to fear: fear the One who, after He has killed, has authority to cast into hell; yes, I tell you, fear Him" (Luke 12:4-5)!

"This is the judgment, that the Light has come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the Light, for their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the Light, and does not come to the Light for fear that his deeds will be exposed" (John 3:19-20).

"Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born again he cannot see the kingdom of God" (John 3:3).

Jesus gets us perfectly well. He knows exactly who and what we are. And something is so fundamentally wrong with us that He declares that if we are to have any hope of escaping our deserved eternal judgment, we must be born all over again.

"Now after John had been taken into custody, Jesus came into Galilee, preaching the gospel of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; repent and believe in the gospel" (Mark 1:14-15).

And so bringing this back to this Lenten and Easter season, the reason that our Lord put on flesh and dwelt among us, was so that He might redeem us from our sin; we truly need a Savior. So Jesus truly does "get us" while He also sees our weaknesses and frailties, and what we need the most, a new life in Him. We are to come unto Him, and not remain in what we were, but what we are becoming in Him.

Take time out before Easter to double check that your behavior, thoughts, words, etc. are in line with Christ's example.

One of the inspiring things for me to do is to re-read the four Gospels. I would suggest that the men start with Mark. It's the shortest of the four. It only has 16 Chapters, and about 30 pages. It's concise and to the point, just the bare facts, at least according to Mark. Also it has a surprise ending, or rather 2 different endings. Not all Bibles include this I do have a Bible that includes both endings. I can share with if you're interested.

For the women I would recommend that you start with Luke. Supposedly he got a lot of his info from Mary, the mother of Jesus. Also he was a physician, a medical doctor (this I've read and/or heard). So he might have a different slant. Is he the one that quotes, 'and she pondered these things in her heart,' referring to Mary. Ponder these possibilities as you read. (24 chapters, about 50 pages)

Note Jesus walked a lot, like most everywhere He went. He rode a donkey once, the triumphant entry into Jerusalem, but mostly he walked, maybe you need to walk more? Not everywhere, but sometimes when you need a break, instead of hitting the fridge, or fast food, etc. go for a walk. A great chance to clear your head. Even if it's just around the block or down the hall. Start small, but start!

If most all that He said in 3 years, can fit into 30 or 50 pages, he really didn't say that much. But what He did say, or at least what they recorded, was pertinent. Do we think before we speak, is it going to help or hinder another?

He also took time to go off by himself, to be with His Father. Do we take time to pray or meditate? To communicate with God, to either speak, (to pray,) or to listen, (to meditate)

There is so much to learn in just reading these books, and it really doesn't take that long. Then apply what you learn, so that you too can rise on Easter morn with a smile on your face and joy in your heart.

MEETING NOVEMBER 2022 MINUTES. Minutes approved.

PASTOR'S REPORT. Projected a cartoon... "It's from our church... We've been called up for active duty." His theme for this year is that it takes all of us - Get involved. Let's make this an even better year than last year.

LINE OF CREDIT. Approved to payoff loan.

FINANCIAL REPORT. Financially stable. 2023 Budget approved.

TITHE REPORT. Important to track economics of church. Tithes up. Expenses up for new year.

APPROVED BY-LAW CHANGES.

Article IX. Section 1. The Trustee Board

The Board of Trustees shall now consist of up to seven active members, but no less than five, two of whom shall be elected annually to serve a term of three years.

Article IX. Section 2. The Diaconate Board

The Diaconate shall consist of up to 8 active members, but no less than six, two of whom are to be elected annually for a term of three years.

Article V

Section 3. Business Meetings. B Regular Church Business Meetings.

The Church shall meet a minimum of two times yearly (including the Annual Meeting), the format and the date of the meeting to be set by the Moderator.

Article III. Section 1. Affiliation

This Church chooses to be not in fellowship with the National Association of Congregational Christian Churches (NACCC) and its regional association.



Although physically imprisoned she had been free spiritually the entire time. Please pray as she transitions back to society and reunites with her family.


Covid created a huge gap in our ministry since we were excluded from some facilities for almost 3 years. We lost track of many of the people who were faithfully attending our services. This was particularly true at Maclaren Youth Facility which kept us out the longest. I was holding a service at Columbia River when a familiar face walked in. It took me a minute to realize he was one of our faithful friends from Maclaren. He had aged out of the juvenile facility and still has time on his sentence. I was greatly encouraged to see him faithful to church after all that time, and still seeking the Lord.

2023 has already been wonderfully blessed throughout our many services. We were able to relaunch our Midweek Bible Study at Coffee Creek. We are enjoying the fellowship and freedom to interact with these inmates in a smaller group setting. We also expanded our Saturday night service back to a 2 hour times slot. This again allows us 2 preaching sessions during that service. We were able to see 9 people pray to receive Christ though out our facilities in January. We are so thankful for all the volunteers, help, and support we have to make this possible.




